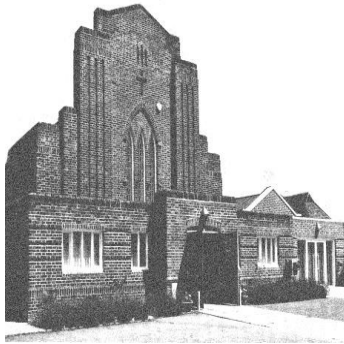




NOTICES & ANNOUNCEMENTS SUNDAY 15TH OCTOBER 2023
