


# NOTICES & ANNOUNCEMENTS SUNDAY 3RD DECEMBER 2023

**TREE OF REMEMBRANCE** – This year the tree on the path between St. Giles' Church and the Church Hall will be our Tree of Remembrance. If you would like to place a star on the tree, there are two ways you can do this: either by making your own star or bauble, writing on it the name of the person you want to remember, adding a ribbon or cord and placing it on the tree, or there will be a basket of wooden stars available in our church vestibule by Shellie's office. During the afternoon of Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> January the stars will be removed from the tree and place on the altar in St. Giles' Church. On Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> January the stars will be blessed during the 10 am Communion Service.
