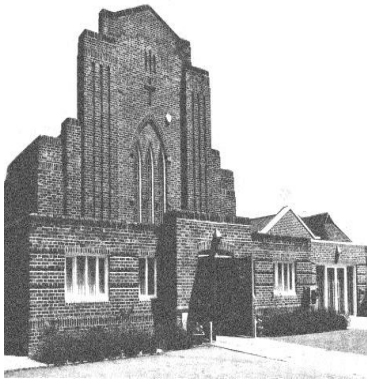




NOTICES & ANNOUNCEMENTS SUNDAY 9TH JULY 2023
